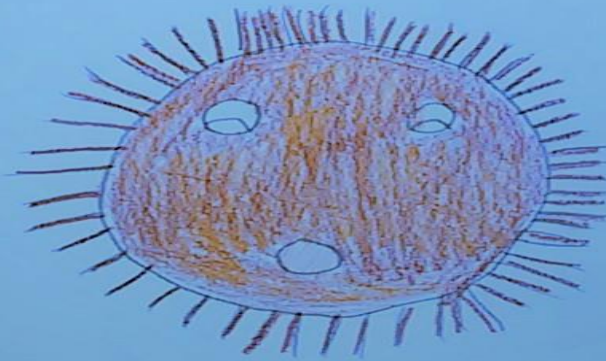
What is an ocean?

An ***ocean is*** a large area of salt water between continents.

There is one world **ocean**, but it is divided into five main areas: the Pacific, the Atlantic, the Indian, the Arctic, and the Southern, or Antarctic.

OCEAN ANIMALS

A water animal is an animal which lives in water for most or all of its life.

A fish is an aquatic animal with gills and fins.

Turtle is an animal which lives in or near water. They lay their eggs on the land.

Dolphin is large, smooth and grey, with a long pointed mouth. They communicate with each other by clicking, whistling and other sounds.

Shark is a large fish that has sharp teeth and a triangular fin on its back which can sometimes be seen above the water.

Crab is a sea animal that has five pairs of legs and a round flat body covered by shell.

Octopus is a sea creature with a soft oval body and eight tentacles (long parts like arms).

Whale is a very large seal mammal that breathes air through a hole at the top of its head.

Eel has a long body. They range in colour from drab gray or black. Maray is an eel.

Jellyfishes are invertebrates because they haven't backbones. They have tiny stinging cells in their tentacles to stun or paralyze their prey before eat them.

Lobster has a rigid segmented body covering and five pair of legs and big pinchers. They eat dead animals but also eat live fish or small mollusks.

Seahorses are tiny fishes that are named for the shape of their head, which looks like the head of a tiny horse. A female lays dozens, sometimes hundreds of eggs in a pouch of the male seahorse's abdomen.

Starfishes are invertebrates. Most seastars have spiny skin and five arms. They eat mollusks such as clams, oysters and snails.

Stingrays have broad fins that run the full length of their bodies, living them a flat, roundish shape. They eat clams, crabs, oysters, shrimps and mussels.

Seals are semiaquatic marine mammals. They are *earless* or *true*, and *eared seals* (sea lions and fur seals). They are carnivores, eating fish, squid or mollusks.
